## TEXAS TEACHER IS FINALIST FOR HISTORY TEACHER OF THE YEAR

**WASHINGTON – June 5, 2006** – National History Day (NHD) announced today that Donna Britt of Sterling High School in Baytown, Texas is one of ten finalists for the *Richard T. Farrell Teacher of Merit Award* for outstanding success in teaching history.

The award is given annually to a teacher who develops and uses creative methods to make history interesting for students.

Britt's creative incorporation of both primary sources and technology enriches the learning of her students and provides an excellent example for other educators of how to incorporate the NHD program into their classrooms.

"Donna is able to challenge her students not only in researching and developing project, but also in stressing the importance of writing skills as an interdisciplinary approach," said L. Hal Davis, social studies instructional specialist for the Goose Creek Consolidated Independent School District. "She is truly making a difference in how students engage in citizenship in their community and beyond."

Britt will be recognized at the NHD Welcome Ceremony on June 11 at 6:30 p.m. in the Nyumburu Amphitheater at the University of Maryland. Britt will receive a commemorative certificate and a collection of outstanding programs from PBS VIDEO, featuring award-winning titles.
